Provide opportunities for Catholic sisters to obtain secondary and postsecondary education degrees.

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
Increase sisters' competencies in their fields, toward greater effectiveness in accomplishing their ministries.



Ensure sisters qualify to continue their education after obtaining their secondary school or college diploma/certificate.

A total of 281 scholarships have been awarded to 165 new and 116 returning recipients since the last reporting period.



2023 Evaluation Report- Executive Summary



Evaluation data collected throughout 2023 indicates that the ASEC Scholarship Program is on track to meet all program objectives by the end of 2024.

Although some program outcomes and outputs require continued monitoring, there is evidence that these will be met by 2024.

Since initiation of the program in 2012 (as of January 31, 2024), the ASEC Scholarship Program has grown to serve 871 unique sisters and women from 125 distinct congregations. Sisters and women served by the program have enrolled at a total of 195 educational institutions (schools, institutes, colleges, and universities) across the seven countries served by the program.

As of January 31, 2024, the ASEC Scholarship Program has awarded 281 scholarships for the 2023 cycle. Of these awards, 165 were provided to newly enrolled students (including 2 lay women) and 116 were distributed to returning students (including 2 lay women). One-hundred and eight (108) awards were distributed to students studying at the secondary level, while 173 were distributed at the postsecondary level.

In 2023, a total of 10 scholarship recipients completed the Scholarship End of Experience Survey. In this survey, recipients are asked if they feel they will be able to utilize the knowledge and skills they acquired from their educational program to benefit their ministry. All respondents (100%, N = 10) strongly or somewhat agreed with this statement, surpassing the projected outcome (75%) by 25%. In addition, 25% (N = 871) of all scholarship graduates have been able to continue their education through an ASEC sponsored program.

ASEC Scholarship Program 2023 successes include: continued high enrollment rates, possible expansion to an additional country in 2024, and the launch of scholarship alumnae attendance at the 2024 ASEC Alumnae Workshops. Challenges encountered in 2023 included staffing transitions, difficulty holding in-person Scholarship Orientations and orienting new staff to Scholarship Program requirements.


